1. Congratulations on completing Marine Science Technician "A" School. The length of the course was 9 weeks and your dates of attendance were 18 September 2006 to 17 November 2006.
2. The Coast Guard has determined that this course provides the 24 hours of classroom training required under OSHA's Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response training requirements (29 CFR 1910.120(e) and (q)) for Coast Guard personnel assigned to pollution response duties. This includes the competencies for First Responder Operations and On Scene Incident Commander. In addition, you are required to obtain 24 hours of supervised on site training to also meet the requirements of 29 CFR 1910.120 (e) and (q). Eight hours of annual refresher training is also required to maintain this certification. This also fulfills the Initial Indoctrination to Marine Safety Course (IIMS) requirements.
3. By completing this course, you have met all E-4 Marine Science Technician rate related performance qualifications outlined in reference (a). Consequently, you have met the rate related performance qualification requirements of reference (b) for advancement to Third Class Petty Officer. Additionally you have completed the Enlisted Professional Military Education (EPME) performance requirements for E-3 and E-4 and have passed the Advancement Qualification Exam (AQE) requirements for advancement to Third Class Petty Officer as outlined in reference (c).
4. The following performance requirement has been deferred in accordance with reference (c). This deferment does not relieve you of your responsibility to perform this task and shall be completed at your new permanent duty station.
